- xiv. So Margie's mother sent for the Country Inspector. The Country Inspector, a jovial man found the issue and fixed it .i.e.adjusted its speed up to an average ten-year level.

### The Road Not Taken

-Robert Frost

#### **Key points:**

- The Road Not Taken is a narrative poem by Robert Frost, first published in the August 1915 issue of the Atlantic Monthly.
- ii. The poem is an autobiographical poem.
- iii. The poem gives an account that sometimes even a small decision may prove to be a larger significance.
- iv. In the poem the poet faces a situation during his travel.He finds two roads at a point where he has to choose one and must abide by his choice.
- v. According to the poem, the poet came across a junction, where his path diverged into two and he had to make a decision of which road to take.
- vi. He stood there for a long time and then decided to take the road less travelled.
- vii. He chose the less travelled road because it was grassy and as far as the road concerned,both were equally worn.
- viii. Both the road lay equally covered in leaves.No traveller had trodden on them that day.
- ix. He also had a feeling that his choice would confront him with new adventures and challenges.
- x. In the end of the poem the narrator regrets over his choice, yet he realised that the things he had encountered and the places he had visited because of this path, had made all the differences in his life.
- xi. In the poem the two roads symbolise the choices that we have to encounter in our life.
