A Bio-Initiative Report in 2012 pointed towards health hazards due to radiation from cell towers. The most common of these are sleep disorder, headache, memory loss, depression etc. More severe problems include paralysis, seizures, irreversible infertility and cancer. There were protests in Mumbai over possible radiation effects of cell phone towers. The protests grew after film actor juhi chawla stepped in. The American Cancer Society says that radiation levels from cell towers are low since the towers are mounted high above ground level and signals are transmitted intermittently.
